6 President's Report

Firstly, a little background.

After much searching for a suitable location for a new shed, a meeting with Mayor Mark Irwin & Infrastructure Director Michael Littleton, resulted in this property being identified and subsequently made available to us.

We took possession on June 1 and our initial objectives were to make the property suitable for our purpose. To this end, we:

Upgraded the electrics to cope with the proposed machinery and

Undertook several other property upgrades included connecting downpipes to soak wells, rust proofing this pergola, paving, garden pruning and tidy up and installation of a new reticulation system.

MEMBERSHIP

We now have 46 Members who have been enthusiastic in setting up the Shed and getting started on projects. About 12 members are here at each session.

Their interests so far are mainly centred on wood working and gardening but it is the intention of the Management that the Shed should be what members want it to be.

Consequently, we anticipate a variety of new activities being introduced in the near future.

Members are kept informed of news and developments via our website and newsletters.

FACILITIES

So far, our facilities include

The first of our Vege gardens (tomatoes)

Work benches, machinery and tools – some donated, some purchased.

Computers and a Book exchange

FUNDING

Funding for the shed has come mainly from the Rotary Club of Karrinyup and also a donation from the Gwelup Christian Church. We also have had two Federal Government grants approved for the purchase of extra tools and machinery and we anticipate receipt of the funds soon.

Additionally, we have received many generous donations of wood, tools, machinery, work benches, paving materials and much more. Some of these donations have come from shed members, others from the general public.

PROJECTS

The main projects we are establishing are:

Community oriented projects whereby we can make contributions to people and groups in our community

Income producing projects to help cover the operating costs of the shed and

Promotion of Men's Health programs

FUTURE

We are currently open from 8.30 to 12.30 on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday and expect to soon open on Fridays as well.

Our aim is to be a successful shed, be good citizens and good neighbours

Our hope is that the City of Stirling recognise the benefits of this shed and see fit to grant an extension of our lease beyond the initial 12-month trial period.
